Although there were remnants of tears on his eyelashes, this little guy was beaming as he was given much love and attention with each band aid he received. This same 8th grade student made sure he safely got to his long-awaited breakfast once he was all patched up. This morning, the younger student brought in a thank-you card for the older student, which I peeked at (since it wasn't sealed). Included with a kind note from this student's parents was a colorful drawing of the PreK student falling out of the car along with a "Thank you" and signature in crayon. It was the 8th grade student who was beaming when she received this heart-warming card.

Besides wanting to spread the joy I felt with this story, I wanted to emphasize the service that this 8th grader voluntarily contributed to one student, which spread to a family, which eventually spread to our school and community. It would have been easy for her to assume this boy's parents would take care of

him, but she took the initiative to help. Our school community is always called to help others in a number of ways, and volunteer opportunities is one of those ways that is available to us as parents.
