## '24-'25 GOOD SHEPHERD SCHOLARSHIP, MARCH 31 DEADLINE

To be eligible for the Good Shepherd Scholarship or the Family Tuition Cap Scholarship, families must complete an application and upload tax documents (2022 or 2023 tax forms) through the **FACTS** 

**Scholarship Management** program. Any family may apply, regardless of religious affiliation. For more information or to apply for these scholarships go to <u>www.goodshepherdscholarship.com</u>. See attached document for more detailed information.

The **Good Shepherd Scholarship** will be \$1,800 in the 2024-2025 academic year for grades K-8 and will cover families within 225% of the Federal Poverty Level. The **Family Tuition Cap Scholarship** is offered to families with more than three students enrolled in the Diocese of Lincoln Catholic Schools. Families pay tuition for the first three students and the rest will be tuition-free (K-12).
