“The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church” (Tertullian). I thought of this quote recently as I was learning about the state of the Church in Nigeria today. In the past year, more than 8,000 Catholics in Nigeria have been killed for practicing their Faith. Yet, the country boasts the highest Sunday Mass attendance in the world. 93% of Nigerian Catholics attend Mass every Sunday. To put this in perspective, attendance in the U.S. hovers around 25%. What Tertullian says does seem to ring true: the more Christians are persecuted, the more they multiply and the stronger they grow.

For Lent, our Student Council decided to host a fundraiser to support Catholics in Nigeria. In just a few weeks our children raised over \$500! These funds will be given to the Missionary Childhood Association (MCA), one of the Pope’s mission societies. MCA’s motto is “children helping children” through prayer, learning and giving. I am so proud of our students’ generosity. Thank you, parents, for forming them so well!
